

CENTRAL ROUTE - 3 NATIONAL PARKS OF CENTRAL DALMATIA

Day 1, Saturday (Biograd-Kaprije)

In the afternoon we set our sails south from Marina Biograd, along the coast of Murter island, where we anchor for a quick lunch. Towards the evening we moor in the picturesque fishing village on the island of Kaprije.

Here you can buy aromatic olive oil, home-grown brandy or try a local speciality – a baked octopus, and later on have a cozy chat with friendly locals. Idyllic fishing village Kaprije is definitely the place where time stops.

Day 2, Sunday (Kaprije-Primošten)

The route leads us to a typical Mediterranean town Primošten, where we berth for the night. The old town centre of Primošten was actually merged with the mainland a long time ago by the locals because of farming and cultivating. The town is nowadays a famous tourist attraction, with many cocktail bars, restaurants and local taverns - "konoba" where you can try the famous Babić wine with some smoked ham and cheese.

Day 3, Monday (Primošten-Skradin)

Early morning cruise towards Šibenik through the natural canal of St. Ante is a unique experience.

We head upriver through spectacular canyon of the river Krka - the largest mussel growing natural habitat in Croatia. On our route we can buy mussels, that we can later prepare for dinner.

We moor in a distinctive and romantic village Skradin, where Krka River plunges into the Adriatic Sea. You take a motor boat to visit the National park Krka, whose seven waterfalls will leave you breathless.

<p>Day 4, Tuesday (Skradin-Kornati N.P.)</p> <p>We set sails north, towards the famous National Park of Kornati, which consists near 100 islands, islets and rocks. The continental part includes only ¼ of the surface of the park, while the rest belongs to the marine eco-system. On the way we stop in one of the lovely coves for lunch and swimming.</p> <p>We overnight surrounded by a beautiful natural ambience in front of stone-made fishing "tavern," where we can taste a freshly caught fish and enjoy in a quiet romantic night that illuminates only starlight.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Kornati archipelago)</i></p>	
<p>Day 5, Wednesday (Kornati N.P.-Telaščica N.P.)</p> <p>Morning cruise, while enjoying a stunning view over the majestic cliffs of Kornati islands.</p> <p>Soon we reach Dugi Otok (Long Island), where we visit Telaščica natural park and admire a view towards horizon from spectacularly 100 meters high cliffs, that guard the western part of Dugi Otok. <p>Day 6, Thursday (Telaščica N.P.-Sali-Brbinj)</p> <p>In the morning we sail through the Mala Proversa passage, that divides the islands of Kornati and Dugi Otok. We make a quick stop in the village of Sali and purchase for 2 more days of supplies.</p> <p>We pass by the islands Krknati and admire its turquoise clear water. We berth before nightfall in a natural cove Brbinj, where we can take a walk through the village. When the crew returns to the boat, captain's dinner is served.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Veli Rat lighthouse)</i></p>	
<p>Day 7, Friday (Brbnj-Veli Rat-Kukljica)</p> <p>On our last day we sail north along Dugi Otok and visit the highest lighthouse in the Adriatic - 45m high "Veli Rat ". We navigate around Ugljan Island and cast a glance at the largest north-Dalmatian city Zadar on our left.</p> <p>For the night we berth in a small town Kukljica - picturesque fishing village, where you can stroll along the promenade by the sea and admire our last sunset aboard.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Sunset behind the Kornati islands)</i></p>
